NRSPP Monthly Focus: Daylight Savings has come to an end, but is your car is the right conditions to be undertaking the evening commute in the dark?

The NRSPP's Quick Fact on the <u>Dangers of Driving at Night</u> highlights the key risks associated with driving at night-time. One of the most important safety factors when driving at night-time is being able to see other vehicles, and giving other vehicles a clear view of you. We



overcome night-time visibility issues by using our headlights, and this is why properly maintained headlights are incredibly important. Having both headlights working properly is essential to safe driving. A vehicle with a single headlight may appear to be a motor cycle and thus may appear to not be taking up the full width of the road. More than two headlights can be confusing for on-coming drivers. 
